WHAT IS THE HAVAMAL?

For many years now our yearbook has carried the title Havamal but, many people have not grasped the significance the name carries. That is why this year, not only the book's title, but also our theme will be Havamal.

The Havamal is a long narrative poem which contains Viking legions and rules of living. It was supposedly stolen by the great war god Odin. No one knows who originally composed it or when, but it has been in existence for many, many years.

It has been handed down through word of mouth, probably being changed and revised through the centuries.

Paul Du Chaillu was probably the first author to put the poem into book form. Many of the verses he quotes were taken from ancient manuscripts found in such countries as Denmark and Norway. Mr. Chaillu quoted the verses as he found them written, in order to preserve their originality and flowing poetic form. Because of this many of the verses contain words which no longer are used in our vocabulary, thus making the true meaning of the verse hard to understand. Yet most of the advise given in the poem could be applied to our daily life. The Havamal contains:

Man's happiness.










The Band Plays On






Golfers Fail To Light Matches

All of the Lady Spikes agreed that the toughest team they played against was Crestview, who ended up as Conference champs.



The FFA also offers chance and opportunity in fields of agriculture. Students take part in a judging contest and also help put out the crops on the FFA farms.



Our team won and was on it's way to the District Competition but was hit by the flu bug and had to drop out. We hope next year will be better.





































This year Plymouth was awarded a Nutrition Grant by the State of Ohio. Mrs. Olewiler, Mrs. Kirkpatrich, and Mr. Tracey were responsible for our abtaining the grant. The Home Ec. department did an extensive study of different types of diets and they learned how to prepare well balanced, nutritious meals.


Foreign language classes made nutritious Pinates and tasty nutritious dishes from other countries.
